Application Process

Like any academic environment, Inspired Leaders' Academy is interested in producing only success stories. There are certain factors that determine success and I look for them when admitting someone to the Full Curriculum. These are explored in the application form, but here are the key attributes I look for:

- 1** First and foremost, entrepreneurs must have a mindset that "circumstances do not effect my commitments." With this attitude, they will complete the program; miss only 2 calls; complete all assignments on time; reply promptly to all correspondence with me; attend all events included in the tuition; make all payments on time—no matter what "life circumstances" may arise. This excludes extreme emergencies only.
- 2** They must have a determination to do whatever it takes to get their message out. Fear is natural and addressed inspirationally at ILA, but all applicants must have a willingness and determination to leave their predictable comfort zones to do what works.
- 3** Entrepreneurs coming out of ILA are up to big things and are willing to play on bigger playing fields than ever!

Please indicate on a 1-10 scale (where 10 is “100%” and 1 is “not at all”) how committed you are to the following ILA standards—no matter what “life circumstances” may arise. (Extreme emergencies are excluded but cannot exceed 2 occasions.):

1. Missing only 2 calls, maximum, determined at start of program. (1 more for extreme emergency).
2. Completing the program.
3. Completing all assignments on time.

4. Replying to all correspondence with Lizabeth within timeframe requested.
5. Attending all live events included in the tuition.
6. Making all payments on time.
7. Leaving the curriculum if you do not meet these standards and either forfeiting the balance of the tuition (within 2 months of program conclusion) or paying a penalty fee.
